



Do you know what to expect on Metro Transit buses when you head back to school?

COVID isn't over. All the requirements we have in school about social distance, face coverings and cleaning apply to Metro Transit, too.

Here's what you can expect.

- Masks on everyone and more space between passengers.
- Longer bus rides and buses driving by you if they have their COVID capacity. Try not to take it personally -- it's not about you.
- If buses make you late, stop in to let them know in the school office – then consider an earlier bus or different route tomorrow. Maybe even do a dry run before April 12.
- Drivers and other riders anxious about their health. Be patient and stay safe.

How to stay safe.

- Travel with a (masked) buddy and keep several seats between you and other passengers.
- A phone in your hand could be a target for theft. Keep it in your purse or pocket.
- Move away from anyone who makes you feel uncomfortable.
- Dial 911 if you feel unsafe and need help.
